Minutes of Regular Board Meeting

The regular meeting of the Board of Directors of Southeast Colorado Power Association (SECPA) was held **March 20, 2024,** at the SECPA headquarters, 27850 Harris Road, La Junta, CO.

1. Call to Order/ Roll Call

President Truman Wright, called the meeting to order at 12:45 p.m. Directors present were Lawrence Brase, Brad Buck, Michelle Gardner, and Merlin Rushton. Clint Anderson and Randy Phillips were absent.

Staff present: CEO Kevin Brandon, COO Mark Hall, CHRO Angela Bamber and Executive Assistant Debbie Howard. Kent Singer, CREA Executive Director, was a guest.

4. Board Meeting Minutes

Motion was made and seconded to approve February 21, 2024 Board minutes. MOTION carried.

5. Chief Executive Officer - Brandon

- Kent Singer, Colorado Rural Electric (CREA) Executive Director gave an overview of CREA's offerings to co-ops, stating that cafeteria style membership is being considered. He asked for contributions to Colorado Advocates for Rural Electrification (CARE), a political action committee that advocates for Colorado's electric cooperatives. Wright asked what safety services are provided to SECPA. Singer stated CREA supplements what co-ops do in-house. La Plata Electric is no longer receiving safety training from CREA. Singer noted that CREA is not consistent with their policies right now in regards to La Plata.
- Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) has rejected Tri-State's rate filing proposal. Tri- State will need to resubmit. Brandon recommends SECPA postpone implementing any rate adjustment until Tri-State's rate filing has been submitted. Directors agreed.
- Board Policies 110-111-112 have been reviewed by Brandon, Directors, were presented for approval. Motion made and seconded to approve policies as presented. MOTION carried.
- Asset Acquisition Agreement between Town of Springfield and SECPA was reviewed. Directors requested that a current certified/recorded plat map (Exhibit A) be included with the agreement instead of the original hand drawn Exhibit A.
- Announced annual meeting notice and ballots have been mailed to membership. Election ballots are being handled by a third party.

6. Finance & Membership - Brandon

- Reviewed January Income Statement, Balance Sheet, various graphs & Check Register. (Included in BOD packet.)
- January Net Margins, \$ 215,050; YTD, \$ 215,050.
- There were 25 new memberships; 31 withdrawals; 11,071 accounts billed.

7. Operations - Hall

- Various kWh graphs, Outages (38), Work Orders, and Line Loss reports reviewed. (Included in BOD packet.)
- Rolling line loss was equivalent to \$49,464.
- Hall gave status of vehicles, including a one-man bucket truck (which has been parked for three years) being sold to Baca County.
- Update given on area crew projects.
- Safety Report: Larry Chavez has passed his SECPA Journeyman test; CREA conducted di-electric testing

on all insulated trucks.
